# **Annual Report 2019**

### 1. Introduction

In the year 2019, the Society continue to achieved significant milestones. Besides managing the Selegie Arts Centre and the Loke Wan Tho Gallery, we have initiated the Selegie Artlane project as part of the commitment to engage local visual artists including photographers to showcase and sell their works.

PSS has gained the support from Council of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Age (C3A), we have designed a Smartphone Photography Course held in collaboration with National Silver Academy (NSA) for senior to encourage them to remain active with photography. Singapore Citizens and Seniors age 50 and above will receive subsidy from NSA.

In terms of operations and finances, for the financial year ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2019, PSS recorded a surplus of S\$129,963 for the year as compared to the surplus of S\$60,674 recorded in 2018. The increase in surplus was mainly due to higher rental income and more income from courses conducted during the year.

# 2. Overseas Engagements

PSS presented members' works depicting Singapore at the Kuala Lumpur Photography Festival 2019 (KLPF), the only annual photography festival in Malaysia. The Society was also invited to curate members' works in 2019 Pingyao International Photography Festival, 2019 Hwangshan Yixian Photography Festival and 2019 Beijing International Photo Week.

The Society continued with its cultural exchange programmes in 2019. A collection of works form PSS members were exhibited in Kyoto, Japan for the Japan International Photographic Federation Cultural Exchange Exhibition (JIPF).

### 3. Talks by Photography Artists and Professionals

PSS organised workshop by guest speakers to present their area of research and creative process. This include fund raising talks and workshops for PSS SPARK Program for youths at risk as following:

# 7. Selegie Artlane Project

In support of the National Arts Council's effort to promote arts in Singapore, PSS had initiated the Selegie Artlane Project during the year. This was a one-day art fair to promote the works of local artists. It was organised by PSS with the sponsorship from Singapore Pools and Singapore Land Authority and with the support of National Art Council, Housing and Development Board, People's Association, MeidaCorp, Singapore Press Holdings, NAFA and other art schools as well as several other photographic societies. The art fair was successfully launched by the Major of Central Singapore District, Ms Denise Phua on 28th September 2019 and attracted the participation of more than 40 local photographers and artists.

### 8. Finance

As noted in the introductory remarks, the Society generated a surplus of \$\$129,963 for FY 2019, \$\$69,289 more than the \$\$60,674 recorded in FY 2018. This huge increase in surplus was mainly due to higher rental income and more income from courses conducted during the year.

## 9. International Federation of Photographic Art (FIAP)

PSS continues to be recognized by FIAP as the national body representing photographic art in Singapore and retains its Operational Member status of FIAP. PSS manages all applications for FIAP distinctions by local photographers, who have achieved a good track record in international salons. PSS also manage applications for FIAP patronages by local institutions or photographic societies holding international exhibitions in Singapore.

# 12. Photography Courses

In order to encourage members to further improve on their photography skills, the Society had conducted several new courses for software such as Snapseed, Affinity Photo and Luminar during the year. In addition, the Society had also enhanced its partnership with the Council of 3<sup>rd</sup> Age by introducing more photography courses for the senior citizens with the subsidy from National Silver Academy. As a result, the income from courses conducted had increased from S\$15,496 in 2018 to S\$62,962 for the year.

# 15. 66th Singapore International Photography Award

The 66th Singapore International Photography Awards (SIPA 2019) was chaired by Jack Goh Kok Leong. SIPA 2019 continues to receive strong interest based on the entries received. SIPA 2019 received a total of 6,393 entries by 366 authors originating from 62 Countries.

The PSS Exhibitor Distinctions continues to be well received locally and internationally. The interest in the distinction continues to increase.

# 16. 4th Lion City International Salon 2019

The 4th Lion City International Salon (LCIS) in Singapore received a total of 6,214 by 387 authors from 47 countries. Thus, re-ascertaining the popularity of LCIS by the global community.

### 17. 4th Pacific Atlantic International Circuit 2019

The 4th Pacific Atlantic International Circuit (PAIC) 2019 was jointly organised by PSS together with reputable photographic societies in USA and Greece. A total of 7,929 entries was received from 650 authors from 59 countries.

### 18. **PSS Staff**

The Society would like to record its appreciation for its dedicated staff in their effort to sustain the daily operations and ancillary projects of the Society while ensuring the needs of members are met.

### 19. **Membership**

The total membership of the Society was 623. The breakdown is as follows:
